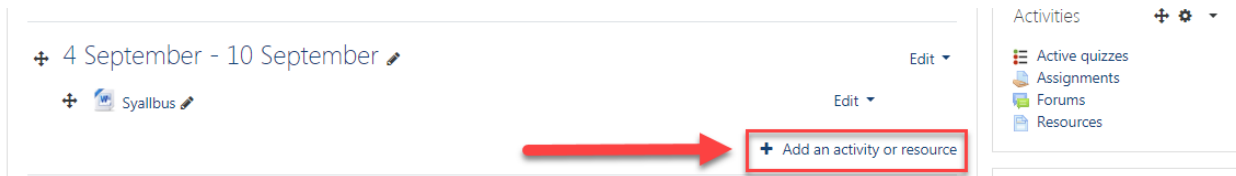


How to use Turnitin to Mark Student Assignments/Assessments

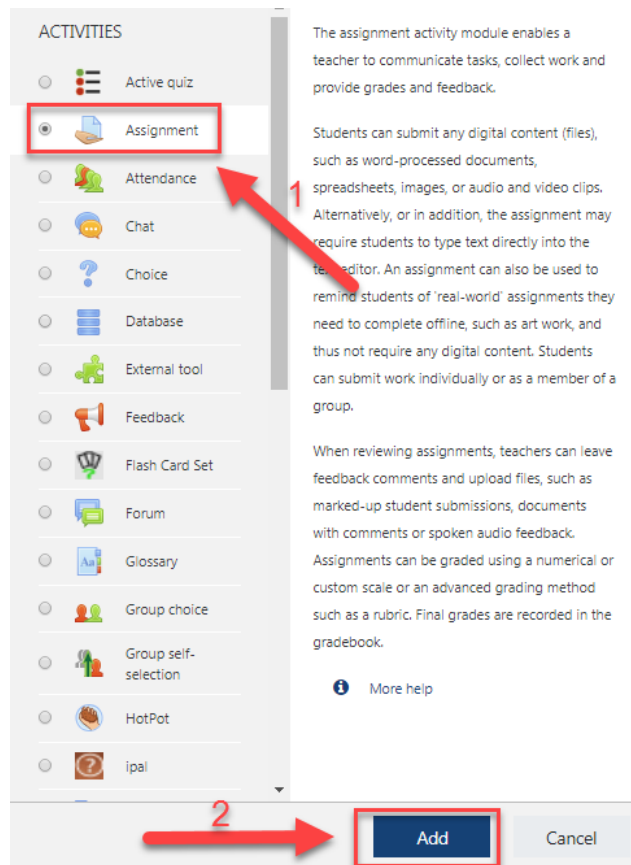
1. Turn **editing on** in your course



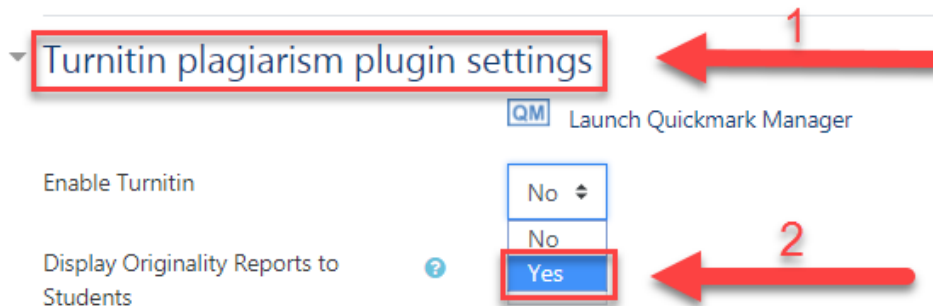
2. Add an **activity or resource**



3. Add an **Assignment**



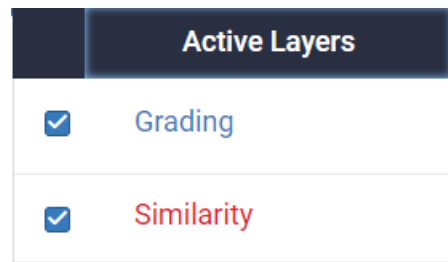
- Give your assignment a name, add the details, scroll down to **Turnitin plagiarism plugin**



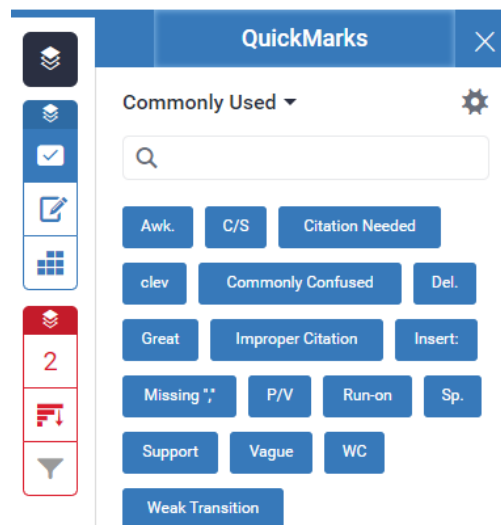
- To grade an assignment in Turnitin, first **open the assignment** on the homepage, then click on the **blue pencil** to open the student's assignment in Turnitin to use the marking tools.

- When the student assignment loads, it will show be a pdf. There is a toolbar on the right side where you will see that the two possible layers of tools: **Grading tools** and **Similarity tools**, and you can choose to use either or both of these.

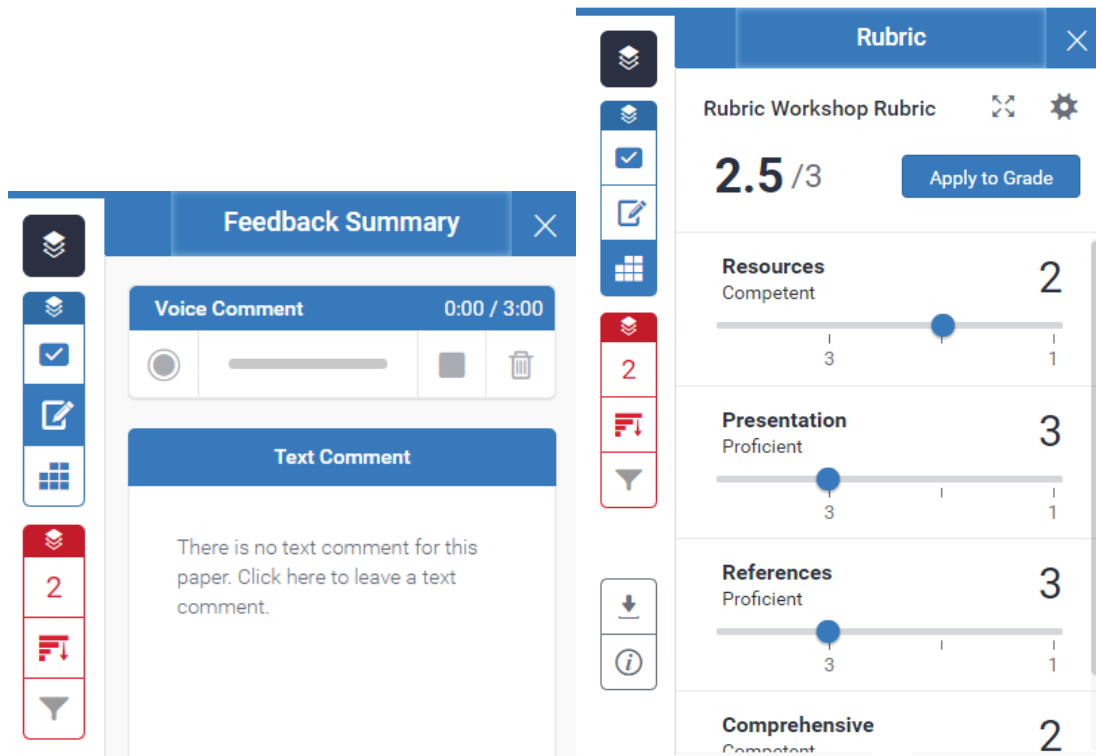


- Grading Tools:** The first tool, **Quickmarks**, include sets of commonly made comments that can be inserted with a single click anywhere in a document to provide feedback to students. You can also create your own set of these.



The second grading tool is the **Feedback Summary**, which allows you to record up to 3 minutes of audio feedback, and write a detailed comment about the assignment.

The third tool is a **Rubric manager**. This allows you to upload your grading rubric and use it to assign a grade and feedback to a student assignment, all within Turnitin (which will be carried over to your ACORN course's gradebook).



8. The Similarity layer comprises a **Match Breakdown** which will provide a percentage of similarity if it finds any. If similarities are found, further breakdown of where the sources of the similarities can be found are available.
